The minutes of the May 04, 2022 and May 31, 2022 Select Board Meetings were approved.

1. SPECIAL TOPICS

a. **DISCUSSION:** Town of Elmore Fireworks

Notes: The Select Board was notified by Trevor Braun that the cost for the fireworks display will be increasing from \$5,000.00 to \$7,500.00 this year. The Elmore Store is talking to the Elmore Community Trust to see if they are willing to contribute. The Elmore Store which has run this event in the past has paid for the fireworks with the exception of the \$2,500.00 that the Town has contributed on a yearly basis. This year the Elmore Store has committed \$1,500.00. The Select Board made a motion and unamously agreed that the maximum amount that the Town would contribute this year would be \$2,500.00 that was approved at Town Meeting. Kate Gluckman representing Black Dog LLC will research and get back to the Select Board.

b. **DISCUSSION:** Town Audit

Notes: Two quotes have been received for performing the audit. However since we did not have a copy of the proposals we could not make a decision. G. Schwartz to ask Sharon Draper how time sensitive this item is or if it can wait until our next meeting in June. The audit will be performed at the end of our Physical year. The Towns Bond application cannot be made until this audit has been performed.

2. ACTIVE ITEMS

a. UPDATE: Elmore highway maintenance facility; working group; land; funding, site work, etc

Notes: The manufacturer of the sand shed (Ryan Burke from Iron Horse Structures) has notified the Town that it will be ready for shipment in mid/end of July and is looking for delivery/erection direction. G. Schwartz to forward the following information to Ryan.

- a) Land has been purchased for our new town maintenance facility with construction to begin late fall 2022 / spring 2023.
- b) It does not make sense at this point to erect the new structure until the Sitework is completed at the new site (summer 2023).
- c) The Town will take delivery when they are ready to ship. We will store the structure on site until the Town is ready to have their crew come in to perform the erection. (Summer 2023).
- d) The Town will perform the unloading and transportation the stored materials to the new site
- e) What the lead time is for Elmore to schedule their crew for the erection.
- f) Ask Ryan to give us a couple of days' notice before shipping so we can have a crew standing by for unloading.

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The most recent drawings from Cross were reviewed. All of our comments including the recommendations from our public meetings have been incorporated. A motion was made to allow G. Schwartz to approve the drawings and forward them to Cross. This motion was unamously accepted.

The Town met with Kate Lalley from LCPC to develop a future use plan for the land that will not be utilized by the new town maintenance facility.

b. DISCUSSION: Peter Danforth; Lamoille County Conservation Dist. Watershed United block grant

Letter of Support: Town Hall and Fish and Wildlife Access applications

Notes: The 30% design drawings and Letter of Support furnished by Peter Danforth were reviewed (copies attached). This work will be performed at no cost to the Town of Elmore. All work will be performed under a grant to improve water quality in the lake. A motion was made to allow G. Schwartz to sign the support letters and forward them to Peter. This motion was unamously accepted.

c. DISCUSSION: Legal Trails; Eagle Ledge - motorized traffic - David McMath

Notes: David McMath was unable to make the meeting. However, past investigations by the Select Board have found that we cannot put up a barricade and there is nothing that the Select Board can do.

d. BRIEF: Zoning Administration; Shoreline District

Notes: After a brief discussion a motion was made to have the Shoreline District zoning remain under the control of the Town. This motion was unamously approved. The Town zoning is stricter than the State.

e. DISCUSSION: Appointment of alternate DRB members; meet candidate (1 year terms)

Notes: This item was tabled until our next meeting

- CONTINUING ACTIVE ITEMS (Update status by primary owner)
 - a. **UPDATE:** Road Commissioner's Report

Notes: See attached Road Commissioner's Report. Regarding the SD Ireland construction yard, M. LaCasse was directed to get an insurance certificate naming the Town of Elmore as an additional insured.

b. UPDATE: Paint/update town offices

Notes: Another Contractor visited the offices but did not provide pricing. A decision was made to wait until the fall to procure additional pricing since the painters are very busy this time of year.

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c. UPDATE: Grant submissions; Sen. Sanders Congressionally Directed Spending Request and Welch Community Project Request 2022

Notes: G. Schwartz spoke to Seth Jensen from LCPC on 6/6/22. He will try to find out the status.

d. UPDATE: Town Meeting Equipment

Notes: Dolan reported the following

- a) The Town currently has a basic Zoom account that cost \$149.00/year
- b) He has added an additional fee of \$40.00 / month for storage
- c) In order to be able to remotely schedule Zoom meetings Dolan added the Zoom Room feature. Since the cost of this feature is \$500.00/year, we are going to use it for a month or two to see if it is worthwhile.

Dear Mr. Pelletier

Through an Ecosystem Restoration Program grant provided by the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation in 2019, the Lamoille County Conservation District (LCCD) conducted a full watershed assessment of the Lake Elmore watershed. The study addressed nutrient (i.e. Phosphorus) and sediment loading stresses due to development patterns surrounding the lake. The study assessed what locations these stressors were most impactful by conduction road erosion inventories, stream walks and shoreline assessments. LCCD worked closely with the town and lake association to identify known issues as well. 20 possible projects were identified and 5 of these that ranked highest were brought to 30% design.

Of the 5 30% designs, the Fish and Wildlife Access project seems like one of the most feasible projects to complete in FY 2022-23. This project will address the storm water runoff from the parking lot which is large and heavily trafficked. In addition, the town and lake association are looking forward to helping LCCD provide educational signage educating the public on the best management practices that are on site and the Lake Wise activities that are currently occurring around the lake.

I fully support LCCD and its partners to move forward on this project as well as any others identified in The Lake Elmore Watershed Action Plan.





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
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




30% Conceptual Design Elmore Town Hall and Store Elmore, Vermont Watershed Action Plan
